





























BEAUTIFYING OUR VILLAGE: A COLLECTIVE EFFORT

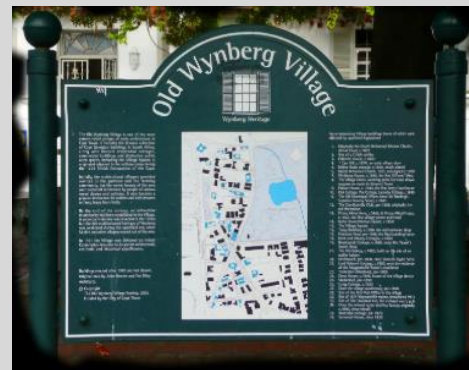
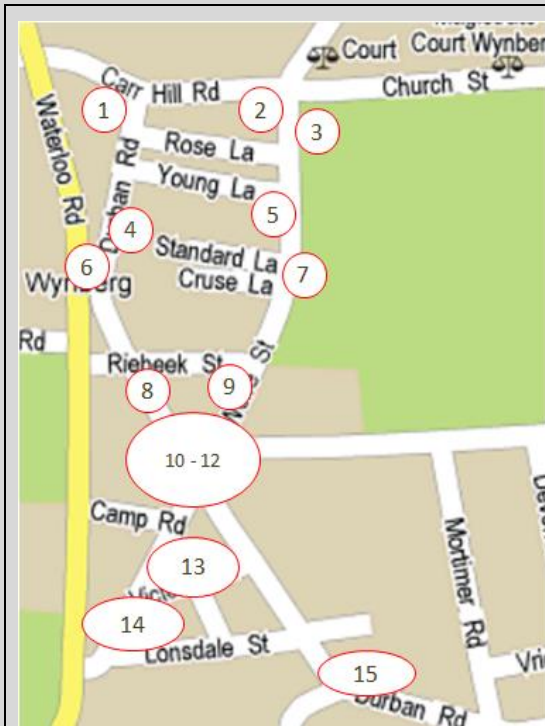
A Story to be Told...

From a village of commercial activity, trading and providing a broad range of services, to the Military Camp to the heart of 'quaint little Chelsea'!

Historically, Wynberg Village has been the nucleus for the development of Wynberg over the last two centuries! There is a story to be told about the Village, its central position in establishing its surrounding communities, its revolving community, society, buildings and houses of interest since its early beginnings to the present day! The Old Wynberg Village Society (OWVS) has embarked on a journey to capture this significant history and position Wynberg as a special place through the introduction of a number of historical signage boards across the Village. This is taking place in cooperation with well-known local historian, Dr Helen Robinson, and the City of Cape Town.

During Phase 1, it is intended to establish about 15 boards that will capture the essence of each section of the Village. The OWVS is currently preparing the approval, positioning and wording for each plaque. As funds are limited, sponsorships and a variety of funding approaches are being considered to ensure the prompt implementation of the project.

During phase 2, it is intended that owners of selected buildings, properties or sites of significance will have the opportunity to record the particular historical significance at their own cost, but with the necessary guidance and technical support from the OWVS Committee.

15. Wellington Entrance – Original farmhouses history → Tenterden, Vredenhof,
